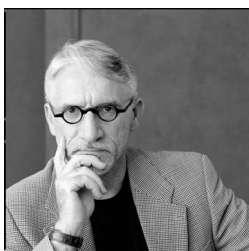

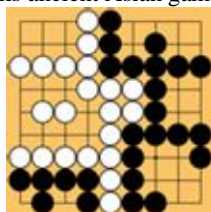

Middlebury College mathematics professor Pete Schumer will give an introduction to the history and rules of this ancient Asian game of strategy.

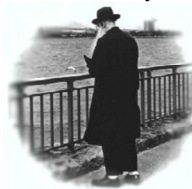


1:30 p.m. Carcassone

The southern French city of Carcassone is famous for its unique Roman and Medieval fortifications. The players develop the area around Carcassone and deploy their followers on the roads as thieves, in the cities as knights, and in the cloisters as monks, and in the fields as farmers.
